LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After taking part in this activity, participants will be able to:

1. Discuss the various ways in which cultural competency can enhance healthcare to vulnerable and under-served population.
2. Identify ethical values intrinsic to assumptions made about groups and populations of people.
3. Discuss how legislation will allow CMS and other government agencies to address issues of disparity in healthcare.
4. Explore how U.S. immigration laws effect the ability of Foreign National Healthcare Professionals to work and stay in the United States.
